Fielder celebrated our hometown hero Colonel Neel E. Kearby, who was awarded the Medal of Honor in January 1944.

March 29 is **National Vietnam Veterans Day**, and this year marked the 50th anniversary of U.S. troops withdrawing from Vietnam.

The Lucretia Council Cochran Chapter, NSDAR, provided commemorative lapel pins to show gratitude for our Vietnam Veterans. Also on display was an issue of LIFE magazine from November 1963 chronicling the war and a supplement to a September 1967 edition of the Arlington Citizen newspaper saluting Arlington's men in service.

### **Arlington Public Library begins centennial celebration**

Did you know this year marks the Arlington Public Library's 100th anniversary? Arlington's first library opened on March 23, 1923, in the Farmer's National Bank. From a modest beginning with 500 books to a massive collection with more than 550,000 items, the library continues growing with Arlington. The library's centennial celebration, or "Celebrating 100 Chapters" as they call it, is underway, with several events planned over the next few months.

# On this day in local history

#### March 25

Groundbreaking began for Arlington's **National Medal of Honor Museum** on this day last year, with the museum expected to open in late 2024. Unlike a war memorial or military museum, it will focus on the Medal of Honor recipients and their personal stories.

# April 21

Although founded in 1876, Arlington wouldn't officially incorporate until several years later. Community leaders drafted a dozen ordinances shortly before the town was incorporated. On April 19, with the ordinances approved by the Town Council, Arlington filed the paperwork with the Tarrant County Courthouse in Fort Worth. It became official on **April 21, 1884**: Arlington, Texas, was now a town. The population was only a few hundred people and wouldn't surpass 1,000 until 1900.

#### April 21

The **Texas Rangers** baseball team, previously known as the Washington Senators, played their first game in Arlington on **April 21, 1972**. More than 20,000 fans packed Arlington Stadium to see the Rangers defeat the California Angels by a score of 7-6. The Rangers finished their first season with 54 wins and 100 losses.

### April 21

One year ago, more than 100 people attended the dedication ceremony honoring Geraldine Mills, where the grounds at Fielder Museum were renamed **Geraldine Mills Heritage Place**. Family, friends, colleagues, city council members, former mayors, residents, and Arlington Historical Society members joined her for the celebratory event.
